Linking people in their community

How does In Your Street work?

If you are finding some of the small tasks around the home are getting too hard for you help may be closer than you think. A call to one of our Community Workers could link you with someone who lives in your street or nearby and is happy to help out.

Care is taken to find people who are genuinely interested in offering assistance to others and who are people you are happy with.

Our workers may also provide you with information about other services or activities in your local area which may assist you.



What type of help is available?

You may need assistance with one or more of the following:

- ‡ Taking the rubbish bin in and out;
- ‡ Hanging out and bringing in laundry;
- ‡ Getting a few items from shops;
- ‡ Getting mail from the letter box;
- ‡ Posting the mail;
- ‡ Walking the dog;
- ‡ Having a chat.

PLEASE NOTE:

We do not ask neighbours to assist with manual tasks such as cleaning and large gardening jobs.

Can I access this service?

You can be part of In Your Street if you are :

- ‡ living in the community; and
- ‡ over 65 years of age; or
- ‡ an adult with a physical disability

and you are finding small tasks around the home difficult to manage. You may be able to be linked to someone living in your local community who can help you through the 'In Your Street' program.

This service is free of charge
