-  To fill the gap in a person's life who through changing circumstances, may no longer be able to have their own dog.

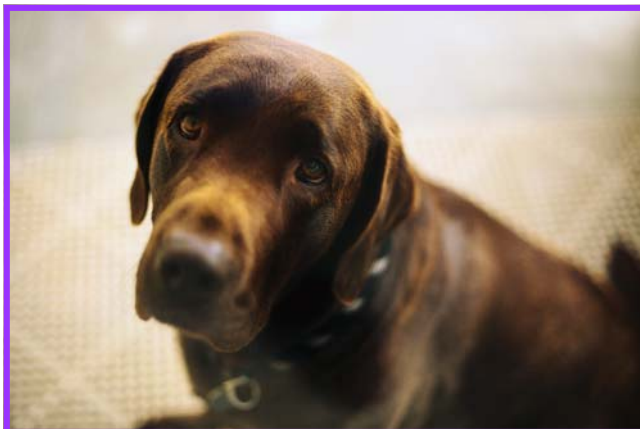

## *How does Violet's Visitors work?*

-  Violet's Visitors provides you the opportunity to interact with a visiting volunteer and their dog.
-  Volunteers and their dogs are interviewed and assessed in accordance with strict standards and guidelines.
-  Volunteers and their dogs are matched to fit with your interests and visits (usually weekly) are arranged at a mutually agreed time.
-  Both you and the volunteer receives support from the program Community Worker.
